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1 DR. SALGADO: Any opposed?  
 2 (No response.)  
 3 DR. SALGADO: The agenda has been accepted.  
 4 We move on to the next item on the agenda,  
 5 the LPC Licensure Hearings for the Applicants Scheduled  
 6 to Appear, Ashton McDonald.  
 7 MS. LOWE: Ms. McDonald, I'm Amy Lowe, and  
 8 I'm the hearing officer for today.  
 9 So Mr. Raines representing the Board, he  
 10 will start if he wants to.  
 11 Do you want to make an opening statement or  
 12 are you just going to go ahead with witnesses?  
 13 MR. RAINES: We can just go ahead with the  
 14 witnesses.  
 15 MS. LOWE: All right. Well, he will present  
 16 his first witness, he will ask questions. At that  
 17 point, you will have an opportunity to ask questions of  
 18 the same witness.  
 19 Once he has finished with all the witnesses  
 20 and the evidence that he wants to present, you will then  
 21 have the opportunity to either speak on your own behalf  
 22 or call witnesses on your behalf. Between the calling  
 23 of each witness, I will allow the Board to ask questions  
 24 to Mr. Raines or to you, whoever is asking questions,  
 25 and then once that is concluded, they will deliberate

 2 Q. And what is your role at the LPC Board?  
 3 A. I am the Deputy Director of the Board.  
 4 Q. And in that capacity as Deputy Director of the  
 5 Board, do you have the opportunity to review applicants  
 6 for licensure?  
 7 A. I do.  
 8 Q. And in that capacity, did you receive and review  
 9 the application for licensure of Ms. Ashton McDonald?  
 10 A. Yes.  
 11 Q. All right. And that starts on Page 2.  
 12 Do you have that in front of you?  
 13 A. I do.  
 14 Q. Okay. And this an application as a Provisional  
 15 Licensed Professional Counselor; is that correct?  
 16 A. That's correct.  
 17 Q. And this is a new license application. You  
 18 received that on July 2 of 2023?  
 19 A. Yes, I did.  
 20 Q. Okay. And if you turn to Page 4, is it accurate  
 21 that she graduated from Lamar University in May of 2023  
 22 with a Master of Science and Applied Psychology and  
 23 Clinical Psychology?  
 24 A. That's correct.  
 25 Q. Okay. And let's turn to Page 6. As part of the

 23 Q. All right. Ms. Lundin, if you would, state your  
 24 name and business address for the record.

 13 We start at Page 15, and that is a copy of her  
 14 transcript at Lamar; is that correct?  
 15 A. Yes.  
 16 Q. And if we move on to Page 19, and through --  
 17 looks like through Page 27, those are actual course  
 18 descriptions for all the courses that she took in her  
 19 clinical program; is that correct?  
 20 A. That's correct.  
 21 Q. Now, as part of your role, did you meet with the  
 22 committee to review this application for licensure?  
 23 A. Yes. The Licensure Committee did review this.  
 24 Q. Okay. And if we turn to Page 28, is that the  
 25 Notice of Intent to Deny that was sent to Ms. McDonald?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Would you explain to the Board what the reasons  
3 were for the Intent to Deny letter being sent here?

4 A. Sure. So based on the review of her transcript,  
5 we had determined that she was lacking several of the  
6 content areas, specifically Counseling Theories of  
7 Personality; Human Growth and Development; Group  
8 Dynamics, Processes and Counseling; Lifestyle and Career  
9 Development' Ethics and Professional Orientation; as  
10 well as a mental health counseling internship.

11 Q. So that letter was sent to her on September 26th,  
12 2023. If you would, turn to Page 31.

13 This is a letter that Ms. McDonald sent to the  
14 Board office indicating that she wanted to be present  
15 for the hearing?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Okay. And my understanding is she could not make  
18 the November 17th hearing date, so she requested that we  
19 have the hearing in January; correct?

20 A. Correct.

21 Q. Okay. And that was scheduled for today.

22 Okay. If you would, turn to Page 37, please.

23 Okay. Can you explain to the Board what we have  
24 here at Page 37? And it goes on through Page 46.

25 A. So this is a letter that we received from her

Page 11

1 exceptions that she noted. What were the exceptions in  
2 that last full paragraph?

3 A. She had indicated that, with the exception of  
4 Lifestyle and Career Development and the mental  
5 counseling internship, that she was lacking those.

6 Q. Okay. So she -- I guess we all agreed that those  
7 two have not been fulfilled. And, again, we'll let her  
8 speak for herself in a minute. But regarding the  
9 remainder of the courses, did you have a chance to  
10 review the information that she provided relative to  
11 each of those?

12 A. I did, yes.

13 Q. Let's just, I guess, start with  
14 Counseling/Psychotherapy Theories of Personality.

15 After review, do you believe that what she took  
16 met the requirements for what we require?

17 A. So based on information that was provided as well  
18 as the course description that was from Lamar  
19 University, the Licensure Committee had actually  
20 originally used that to fulfill the abnormal behavior  
21 requirements just because it talked specifically about  
22 diagnosis and the DSM, so it fit with abnormal behavior  
23 content area.

24 Q. And one course -- is it accurate that one course  
25 cannot be used to meet different multiple categories?

Page 10

1 just kind of explaining, you know, what courses she  
2 feels that she is lacking, and but also how she feels  
3 that she does meet some of these academic requirements  
4 that we determined initially that she was missing  
5 coursework in the content area.

6 Q. And I know Ms. McDonald is here and present and  
7 going to explain that to us in a minute, but I want to  
8 address a few things.

9 And this is something we just received this week;  
10 right --

11 A. Correct.

12 Q. -- on January the 15th?

13 Okay. One thing she explained, and I'm sure  
14 she'll explain more, is that she also has worked toward,  
15 I think licensure or something in Texas; is that  
16 correct?

17 A. Yes. Sounds like Texas has -- maybe you could  
18 speak on this a little bit more, but Texas has, with  
19 their psychology board, they have a Master's level that  
20 you're able to apply with them for, and it seems like  
21 that was her initial path whenever she was in Texas.

22 Q. All right. So in the bottom of that first page,  
23 she goes on to discuss each of the different categories  
24 where we said that she didn't have the proper coursework  
25 and explains that in detail, but there was a couple

1 A. Correct.

2 Q. So the Personality and Psychopathology course  
3 that she discussed using for the  
4 Counseling/Psychotherapy Theories of Personality has  
5 already been used for another category?

6 A. Correct.

7 Q. Okay. Let's go to Human Growth and Development.  
8 She indicated the Social, Cultural and  
9 Developmental Psychology, course PSYC 5340, would meet  
10 that category. Have you reviewed that, and did you have  
11 an opportunity to determine whether or not you thought  
12 they may be accurate?

13 A. I did review it. I reviewed the information that  
14 she provided as well as the description and did not feel  
15 that it would met that specific requirement.

16 One of the main -- within the course description,  
17 one of the main goals was talking about the brain  
18 function, and I didn't see a lot about actually learning  
19 about human growth and development across the lifespan.

20 Q. Okay. Let's go to Page 41, Group Dynamics,  
21 Processes and Counseling. She indicated Advanced  
22 Psychotherapy, PSYC 5313, to meet that class.

23 A. Uh-huh.

24 Q. Is that one that was accepted originally?

25 A. Let's see.

1 That was not, no.

2 Q. Okay. And do you believe that the Advanced

3 Psychotherapy course meets the requirement of our rules?

4 A. The course description made it seem that it was

5 more of an overview course within multiple topics as

6 opposed to group counseling specifically.

7 Q. The next category is Lifestyle and Career

8 Development. Originally she indicated that she used

9 Learning and Motivation, PSYC 5340, and she said she

10 understood why that course does not meet the criteria

11 and proposes Personality Assessment, PSYC 5312, is

12 meeting the requirement of that course. And have you

13 reviewed that? Did you have an opportunity to make a

14 determination about that?

15 A. I did review it. Again, I do not feel that that

16 meets the requirements. You know, in her letter, she

17 had, Includes coverage of lifestyle and career

18 development/vocational Choices, but, again, it needs to

19 be a full course that covers those specific areas.

20 Q. Okay. On Page 43, we have Ethics and

21 Professional Orientation, and she indicated that her

22 course Ethical and Legal Implications, PSYC 5305, would

23 meet the criteria of that. And did you have an

24 opportunity to make a determination regarding that

25 course?

Page 15

1 employed at The Psychology Clinic in Lake Charles, and

2 she talks about accumulating client hours that are

3 there.

4 First, does the Board allow individuals to obtain

5 hours in that way to count towards the internship?

6 A. We don't, no. It has to be part of a graduate

7 program.

8 Q. And do you have any concerns about individuals

9 obtaining hours while working but not under the Board's

10 watch, if you will?

11 A. Yeah. So in order to provide any type of mental

12 health counseling services in Louisiana, you would have

13 to be licensed or provisionally licensed and under the

14 active supervision of a board-approved supervisor. So,

15 you know, if they were providing services within the

16 scope of practice as an LPC or PLPC, then they should

17 not be performing those services.

18 Q. All right. Based on what you reviewed, the

19 information that was provided by Ms. McDonald, do you

20 continue to believe that she does not meet the full

21 requirements of the Board's rules and regulation to be a

22 PLPC?

23 A. I do.

24 Q. All right.

25 MR. RAINES: That's all the questions I have

Page 14

1 A. I did review that one, and I -- with Licensure

2 Committee, you know, reviewing that as well. Our rules

3 specifically say the ACA Code of Ethics, and I know the

4 majority of that course, it looks like it was the APA

5 and the BACB Code that was covered. It sounds like ACA,

6 the Code of Ethics, was included in that course, but

7 very little was included in that.

8 Q. Okay. All right. And then it looks like the

9 last category would be the mental health counseling

10 internship, and she took, it appears to be three

11 practicum, and then talks about, you know, direct

12 face-to-face hours, client hours and that kind of thing.

13 Is it accurate that the practicum that she took

14 did not give her enough direct face-to-face hours as are

15 required under our rules?

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. Okay. Is there anything else about that

18 internship that would not meet our rules requirements?

19 A. No. So we do require the mental health

20 counseling practicum and internship. Based on her hours

21 that she had completed, we did give her credit for the

22 mental health counseling practicum, but because she

23 didn't complete enough hours, we weren't able to give

24 her credit for the internship as well.

25 Q. I know Ms. McDonald indicated she's currently

Page 16

1 for her.

2 If you have any questions, you can.

3 MS. LOWE: Did you want to ask any

4 questions?

5 MS. MCDONALD: I don't know that I had I

6 guess specific questions about that. I mean, I can't

7 say that I disagree with the majority of the things that

8 you said.

9 I do know that there is a distinction

10 between the two fields, and I felt that looking at the

11 coursework, you can see that the areas that you

12 mentioned were not maybe emphasized as much as, you

13 know, in the counseling program.

14 I do feel that I have -- you know, I have

15 learned this material. Maybe not the same way that

16 students would in a counseling program, you know, maybe

17 not to the same degree of emphasis, but I do feel that I

18 have had all of this in some way or another. And I

19 definitely would not be here today if I thought that,

20 you know, I would just walk into an office and just, you

21 know, kind of just do whatever, you know. Like I do

22 feel that I would be an effective therapist or

23 counselor, you know, if that were the case, and so I

24 wouldn't be here today if I thought that I didn't have,

25 you know, this knowledge in some way, shape or form.

 2 But I'm also not disagreeing with you  
 3 though. And that's kind of why I'm here, to see if it  
 4 even was a possibility, you know, for my maybe not so  
 5 typical, you know, way of meeting this criteria to be a  
 6 possibility. And, you know, maybe it's not, but I had  
 7 to see it through, so I understand.  
 8 MS. LOWE: Okay. All right. Any other  
 9 witnesses, Mr. Raines?  
 10 MR. RAINES: No. We'll rest.

 12 give you an opportunity. Did you want to call any  
 13 witnesses other than speaking for yourself?

 17 before she's steps away from the table?  
 18 DR. SALGADO: Any questions?  
 19 (No response.)  
 20 MS. LOWE: All right. So, Ms. McDonald,  
 21 this is your opportunity to address the Board and make  
 22 any statements on your own behalf.  
 23 Yeah. Sorry. Mr. Raines is still going.  
 24 MR. RAINES: I was just going to say, why  
 25 don't we swear her in.

Page 19

1 level psychology programs in Texas are typically longer  
 2 than the ones here in Louisiana. They're also quite  
 3 different in that the Texas ones are designed to prepare  
 4 student for practice as Master-level providers and  
 5 clinicians.  
 6 Because there is no Master's level license  
 7 to practice psychology here in Louisiana, students here  
 8 do not have the same level in clinical training as they  
 9 do in Texas. My coursework and program in Texas did  
 10 train me to competently provide therapy. In the on-site  
 11 clinic at Lamar University, I saw clients of all ages  
 12 and with a wide range of diagnoses and presenting  
 13 problems. I worked with couples, children and families.  
 14 We were trained in a variety of theoretical approaches  
 15 as well as various therapy modalities such as CBT, REBT,  
 16 motivational interviewing, solution-focused therapy, as  
 17 well as many others.  
 18 Our wonderful clinic director encouraged us  
 19 to consider all therapy modalities, but to always  
 20 remember that the client-therapist relationship was the  
 21 single most important determining factor in the  
 22 effectiveness of therapy.  
 23 If you grant me this provisional license, I  
 24 give you my word that I will always do my best to  
 25 present myself as a positive reflection of this Board as

 14 making this case, I'm not saying that I believe that the  
 15 fields of psychology and counseling are identical. I  
 16 know that they're not. I don't believe that every  
 17 individual with a Master's in psychology should be  
 18 eligible for license as an LPC.  
 19 My goal here today is to make a case for why  
 20 my training and experience qualifies me to competently  
 21 practice as a mental health therapist.  
 22 I know psychology is a broad field, and  
 23 psychology programs differ drastically depending on the  
 24 state, the length, you know, if there's like a specific  
 25 type of psychology that it is. For example, Master's

1 well as be professional as a whole. I can assure you  
 2 that I will put the same passion into my work as a  
 3 counselor as I have with this case because that's who I  
 4 am as a person. When I find something that I'm  
 5 passionate about, I put my whole self and dedication  
 6 into it. And as I state in the document, my reason for  
 7 coming here today and providing this very lengthy and  
 8 perhaps overly ambitious argument is for no other reason  
 9 than my passion to serve others by providing exceptional  
 10 psychotherapy.  
 11 Thank you guys.  
 12 MS. LOWE: Does anyone have any questions  
 13 for Ms. McDonald?  
 14 (No response.)  
 15 MS. LOWE: Okay. Do you have any other  
 16 evidence to present or...  
 17 MS. MCDONALD: I mean, kind of sort of.  
 18 MS. LOWE: Yeah, sure.  
 19 MS. MCDONALD: I did bring other things. I  
 20 mean, I didn't know what there would be like questions  
 21 about, so I -- I feel that that would have been more  
 22 helpful if there was like, Okay, you know, this specific  
 23 point, what do you have for this? But I feel like the  
 24 is idea is already, you know, as a whole that it's just  
 25 not a possibility, then that might just be a waste of



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1 time, so I don't know. I mean...

3 would like. If you want to present anything else, you

4 have that opportunity.

5 MS. MCDONALD: I guess I'm not really sure

6 how -- I'm feeling like it's already going in like the

7 no direction. But, I mean, there were no specific

8 questions, so, I mean -- are there any other questions?

10 MS. LOWE: Looks like there are not.

11 MS. MCDONALD: Okay. Then probably not.

1 supervised clinical experience with a therapist at

2 Oceans Healthcare in Kenner from November of '21 through

3 October of '23, and she listed who her administrative

4 supervisor was there and her LPC Board-approved

5 supervisor. She had a Documentation of Experience form

6 that she included; however, she was notified that

7 because her application was subject current licensure,

8 she did not meet the requirements of 503(A), the Board

9 intended to deny her application. Specifically she did

10 not complete a sufficient number of face-to-face

11 supervision hours because she was not under active

12 supervision during the duration of her original

13 licensure has as a LPC. She ended up being 35 hours

14 short for her face-to-face supervision hours, so that

15 was the main issue with her application. So she was


